Definition

Autism is a lifelong developmental disability that affects how people perceive the world and interact with others.

- It is not an illness or disease
- Often people feel being autistic is a fundamental aspect of their identity.
- Autism is a spectrum condition.
- All people with autism share certain difficulties, but being autistic will affect them in different ways.
- All people on the autistic spectrum learn and develop - with the right sort of support.

Sensory differences

- Sound
- Sight

- Touch

Obsession, repetition and routine

- Dislike of changes to routines
- Rituals

Anxiety

- Losing patience
- Always thinking about the worst outcome
- Difficulty concentrating

Organising and sequences

- Processing information
- Predicting outcomes of actions
- Understanding the concept of time
